ELVERSON'S ROLE IN THE AMERICAN IRON INDUSTRY PRESENTATION

ocal author and historian Bob Patry will deliver a historical presentation titled "Elverson, PA: Home of The Hands That Rocked The Cradle of The

American Iron Industry." The one-hour presentation will be held at 7 p.m. on Sept. 18th in the Springfield Room at Hopewell Manor on Elverson's Historic Main Street. The event is free and open to the public, but donations will be accepted to benefit the Elverson Historical Commission. Light refreshments will be served.

Patry's presentation will provide an overview of the history of Elverson area iron furnaces, focusing on the families that built the local furnaces, the iron making process, the region's role during the American Revolution, and the collapse of the Elverson area iron industry.

Patry is a former Elverson resident and past chairperson of the Elverson Historical Commission. He is the author of the 2011 book "The History of Our Community: Elverson, Pennsylvania." He still is a volunteer with both the Elverson Historical Commission and the Caernarvon Historical Society. Most recently he has written a play about the region's involvement in the American iron industry.

The Elverson Historical Commission will be selling books and other historical items before and after the presentation.

How Well Do You Know Elverson Borough?

onna Daprile was the grand prize winner of August's "How Well Do You Know Elverson Borough?" contest. She and five other Elversonians knew that last month's photo of a light fixture resembling a 19th century lantern that was placed on a shelf next to a red door was located on the Heritage Medical Building at the southeast corner of Main and South Pine streets. She let me know between August 3 and August 6 and her name was drawn to be the grand prize winner of a \$10 gift certificate at the Elverson Deli. The other five who knew the answer received a free beverage at the Deli. *The winners' list printed above has led me to institute a new contest rule - only one entry per family.*

August's puzzle was a tough one. There are many doors with decorative lights beside them in the borough, but only three lights with this lantern design are placed on a shelf next to a red door. The one pictured is one of three lanterns illuminating the doors of the Heritage Medical Center (facing the parking lot) and one of the two that are placed to the left of the door. I gave credit to those who guessed the central door or the side door on the east end of the building.

The Heritage Medical Center, which is located at the southeast corner of South Pine and Main Streets, is owned by Dr. Gordon R. Eck. It is a lovely Colonial reproduction constructed by Stoltzfus Enterprises in 1998 and currently houses the offices of four doctors. Gordon R. Eck, D.O., maintains a practice in Family and Geriatric Medicine; Phoenix Rehabilitation offers Physical Therapy treatments; John F. Perry, M.D., specializes in Orthopedic Surgery and Andrew Fieo. M.D., owns a practice in Gynecology and Obstetrics.

I personally enjoy walking past this lovely building on my way to the post office or into the heart of the borough.

THE SUNOCO PIPELINE THROUGH ELVERSON

Workers with hard hats, trucks parked where vehicles rarely travel, measuring, spray painting, digging; all part of making sure our borough is a safe place to live. Don't be alarmed, this is a normal process!

Sunoco Pipeline L.P. (SPLP) owns, operates, and maintains an existing pipeline that passes through Elverson Borough. This pipeline has safely transported petroleum products for many years. Transport of product will cease in the next few weeks. Sometime between September 2013 and April 2014 the pipeline will be tested under higher pressure to verify the strength of the pipe. Pressure tests will be performed with water that is colored with an environmentally safe biodegradable color dye in the event of a leak.

When the work is completed, the pipeline will transport natural gas liquids (NGLs) to the Marcus Hook refinery. The products being transported starting in 2014 have no known toxicological risks. The project will provide 450 total construction jobs and has a total capital investment of \$ 600,000,000.




